The rubric is not meant to be an evaluative instrument but a tool for providing feedback to peers for classroom visits. There are five teaching categories:

Classroom climate Organization and pace of session Promoting student understanding and retention Providing student evaluation and feedback Promoting self-directed learning

Associated with each category are questions that address key components of each of the categories. These questions can help peer visitors anchor their observations and provide a focus for follow-up debriefing conversations.

Teaching Category: Promoting Student Understanding and Retention This category addresses the teacher's approach to explaining content, having students meaningfully interact with that content, and promote understanding and remembering of content.
